Our new cohort of 'Little Learners' (2 year olds) have settled into their new setting well and are enjoying the new learning opportunities.

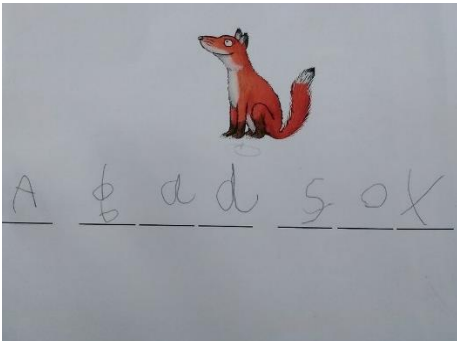
Recently, children have been exploring mud and their natural environment, digging, investigating, planting sunflower seeds and watching them grow.

A Visit from PCSO Aaron -

Our Reception and 30 hour Nursery children had a brilliant time talking to local PCSO Aaron, who explained all about what the police do to us.

We listened to all of the information Aaron told us and asked him questions, tried on the police uniform and had a look in the police van! Reception children then used their phonics knowledge to write about their experience. We even made our own police badges!

Questions we asked Aaron:

- "Why do the police arrest people?"
- "Do you use the walkie talkies to talk to people?"
 - "Why's that (hat) only for a girl?"
- "Do you only have vans and motorbikes?"
 - "Have you got dogs in your van?"

Questions Aaron asked us:

- "This is called the big red key. What do you think this could be used for?"

- "What could this camera be for?"



A Visit from the Fire Brigade -
