Spelling/Times-tables

Across the year, children will continue to learn about spelling rules and different times-tables and will get regular homework to help them develop their knowledge in these areas. If you wish to extend their learning at home, children can practise spellings from a spelling list I will provide. Furthermore, by the end of the year children should be fluent in their knowledge of the 2, 5 and 10 times-tables so these could also be practised.

Science – everyday materials and animals including humans. History – Why are some places special? (focus on local buildings of historical significance) Art – collage and observational drawing RE – Christianity

<u>PE Kits</u>

Important Reminders

<u>Reading</u>

Children will continue to be expected to read at home at least three times a week (with extra comments being rewarded with a dojo for each). To help develop fluency when reading, encourage them to break down the word into sounds, using their knowledge of phonics. Reading with an adult is also a great chance to develop their comprehension so challenge them by asking questions based on what they are reading. I will be sending out a list of example questions to help test them and develop their skills.
