Dear Parents and Carers

Welcome back to school, I hope you all had a great summer, although I know the weather wasn't brilliant. (I was camping!) The children all look really smart in their uniforms and I want to thank you all for ensuring this. You will have noticed that all children from Year 1 to Year 6 have a new book bag and personal organiser. These are to support children with their independence, trying to give you access to immediate information and to be used as a teaching tool. In order to do this, they need to be taking them home and bringing them back every day. They have quickly got used to these so please support them with this and check in their bags for information going backwards and forwards to school and staff will remind them to get any paperwork out of the bags from home.

Breakfast Club

Breakfast club has resumed this week! The doors open at 8:15am and close at 8:30am. The children will stay in Breakfast Club until their start times when they will be sent straight to class.

Teatime Club

We have received some funding to run a FREE teatime club for the year, this will run in a similar way to Breakfast Club. Children can have a piece of toast and a drink whilst either completing their homework or doing some reading along with other activities arranged by staff.

Ideally, we would like to know the week before which nights children would like to attend so we can ensure there is enough staff available to run the club. Mr Murphy will be running the club and can be notified at the bottom of the yard or via Class DOJO.

The club will run from the end of the school day until 4:15pm. Children should be picked up at the Breakfast Club entrance near the nursery at the end of the session. Please be aware that pick up time needs to be prompt as staff running the club finish work at 4:30pm. Thanks for your support in this manner.

First Aid updates

Following recent first aid training we are slightly changing what we do in the case of minor bumps and injuries. If a child obtains a minor head injury (any injury from the neck upwards) the class teacher / teaching assistant will inform parents via Class DOJO. If it is a more serious injury then you will be contacted via telephone by a member of staff. If you have any queries regarding the injury please message the member of staff rather than contacting the school office as it is unlikely that the office staff will be aware of what has happened. Injury/bumped head slips will still be sent home at the end of the school day.

It is vitally important that **ALL** absences are reported to the school office on the first day of absence to notify us of the reasons for absences and the expected date of return, otherwise they may be recorded as unauthorised which could possibly lead to referrals to the Attendance Improvement Team or legal proceedings.

Absences can be reported by contacting the school office on 01740 651512 or emailing the school / Mrs Gilyeat at <u>deanbank@durhamlearning.net</u> or <u>s.gilyeat201@deanbank.durham.sch.uk</u>. Where absences persist beyond 1 day, please keep in regular contact (ideally daily) with the school.

Please ensure **ALL** appointments are made out of school hours (where possible). If your child is attending an appointment first thing on a morning please ensure to inform the school office to allow lunch arrangements to be in place upon their return. Evidence of appointments must be shown to the school office or emailed to Mrs Gilyeat to ensure our records are correct at all times.

Although we have seen an improvement in attendance we are still working on improving this further. Guidance for school attendance can be found at <u>https://www.gov.uk/school-attendance-absence</u>. If you have any concerns please contact Mrs Gilyeat.

Children's expected attendance is 96%, our whole school attendance current stands at 91.98%. (Thursday 9th September 2021)

Although we monitor our attendance really closely we are also expected to report our Persistent Absence. If a child is absent for 10% of their school sessions e.g. their attendance is less than 90%, then they are classed as being persistently absent. The expectation is that our persistent absence is below the national of 10.8%, our rate is currently 21.88% (Thursday 9th September 2021).

Attendance in schools - Who is a parent?

It's important that schools and local authorities are aware that parents may be recognised differently under education law, than under family law. Section 576 of the Education Act 1996 states that a 'parent', in relation to a child or young person, includes any person who is not a parent (from which can be inferred 'biological parent') but who has parental responsibility, or who has care of the child.

For the purposes of education law, the department considers a 'parent' to include:

*all biological parents, whether they are married or not

*any person who, although not a biological parent, has parental responsibility for a child or young person - this could be an adoptive parent, a step-parent, guardian or other relative

*any person who, although not a biological parent and does not have parental responsibility, has care of a child or young person

A person typically has care of a child or young person if they are the person with whom the child lives, either full or part time and who looks after the child, irrespective of what their biological or legal relationship is with the child.

Example: This may be a foster carer or family and friend's carer who does not have parental responsibility but has been delegated the responsibility for taking day-to-day decisions about the child.

In cases where a person is not the biological parent of a child, does not have 'parental responsibility' for that child and that child no longer lives with them, it's unlikely that they will be recognised as a 'parent'. Any disputes about whether a person is a child's 'parent' within the meaning of section 576 Education Act 1996, are for the courts to decide.
