Staffing for September

It's always a relief as a Head Teacher when we get past the deadline for resignations at the end of May and I can see which staff are continuing to work alongside me.

Transition can be difficult for some pupils and it helps reassure them if they know which teacher they will be getting in September.

We have admitted over 40 children since September and now have nearly 210 pupils so I have made the decision to employ two teachers to teach in Year 5, our largest class with 34 pupils. I will split the children into two mixed ability groups for English and Maths and then they will come back together in an afternoon for foundation subjects. This means they will be in smaller groups for these subjects but back with friends, hopefully the best of both worlds.

We also have some Senior Leaders who are going to job share to ensure we keep their expertise in the class but they are released for management time to support other areas of development in the school.

Attendance and Safeguarding

If your child is absent from school it is your responsibility to contact the school office with a reason for their absence.

ALL absences must be reported to the school office on the first day of absence (by 9:30am) to notify us of the reasons for absences and the expected date of return, otherwise they may be recorded as unauthorised which could possibly lead to referrals to the Attendance Improvement Team.

Absences can be reported by contacting the school office on 01740 651512, emailing school on deanbank@durhamlearning.net or sending a message to **Mrs Northcott** on Class DOJO. Where absences persist beyond 1 day, please keep in daily contact with the school.

For the purpose of Attendance, a "Parent" is defined as:

- Any natural parent, whether married or not
- Any parent who, although not a natural parent, has parental responsibility as defined in the Children Act (1989) for a child or young person
- Any person who, although not a natural parent, has care of a child or young person

The Law

You need to make sure your child attends school regularly and on time. Because parents are responsible for this duty in law, you will be **breaking the law** if you do not do this and there are no good reasons for missing school.

Section 7 of the 1996 Education Act states that parents must ensure that children of compulsory school age receive efficient full-time education suitable to their age, ability and aptitude to any special educational needs they may have, either by regular attendance at school or otherwise. A child is of Compulsory School Age at the beginning of the term following their 5th birthday.

The Education (Pupil Registration) (England) Regulations 2006, as amended by 2016 regulations, require schools to take an attendance register twice a day, once at the start of the morning session and then again during the afternoon session.

The School and Local Authority want to help you if you have a problem.

If attendance does not get better or you do not accept help and support offered, the Council may issue you with a warning notice, Penalty Notice or ask you to attend an interview to ask you questions about whether you have broken the law.

Under the Education Act 1996, the Local Authority has a statutory responsibility to ensure that parents secure education for children of compulsory school age and where necessary, use legal enforcement.

If you go to court and are found guilty of an offence, you could be fined up to £1,000 for a less serious offence or up to £2,500 if the law breaking is more serious.

In very serious cases, the court may involve the probation service or consider up to 3 months in prison. Once you have a criminal record, this will have serious implications when you apply for a permanent or temporary job.
