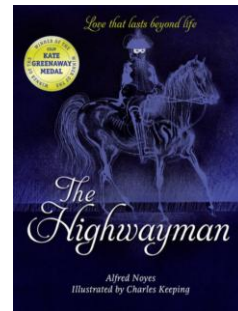
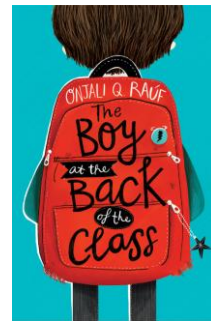
Year 5 spring newsletter

This term our lessons will include:
